



# Weatherization program



## Can you answer Yes to any of these questions?

- Do you struggle to make ends meet?
- Do you struggle to keep your home's temperature comfortable?
- Do you want to save energy by making your home more energy efficient?

Sometimes an unexpected illness or job loss turns your finances upside down ... or your fixed income just doesn't stretch far enough. When that happens, KCP&L's Weatherization Program may be able to help.

## Who is eligible for the program?

Both homeowners and renters can qualify for the program. To be eligible, you must be a KCP&L customer and have:

### Homeowners

- Household earnings at or below the current income guidelines. (See chart.)
- Received electric service from KCP&L for a minimum of one year.
- Household energy consumption of more than 3,000 kWh per year.

### Renters

- Met the same eligibility requirements as homeowners.
- Full responsibility for the payment of electricity bills.
- An agreement under contract with a local weatherization provider that your landlord will:
  - Pay no less than 50 percent of the total cost of the energy efficiency.
  - Not raise the rent for at least two years from the date of completion of installation of the energy efficiency measures.

## How do you apply?

You can apply through your local community action agency. Applications are taken year-round on a first-come, first-served basis.

## How does the agency determine which weatherization measures will be installed?

Your local agency will use a point system to review several factors, such as your income and the type of fuel your home uses to heat and cool. Typical services include installing insulation, caulking windows and repairing heating and central cooling systems.

## Are there benefits to weatherization?

Yes, many. They include:

- Saving as much as 31 percent on heating and cooling annually.
- Resolving energy-efficiency concerns before energy bills get too high.
- Allowing you to allocate money saved on energy bills to other household expenses.

## Are other programs available?

Dollar-Aide, assists eligible individuals and families during times of need by paying their utility bills to avoid loss of service. Administered by the Mid-America Assistance Coalition (MAAC) and United Way of Greater St. Joseph, KCP&L matches every dollar contributed with a 50-cent energy credit. Your local agency may have additional information on other available programs.

### Income Guidelines\*

Your household income cannot exceed the levels listed below to be eligible for the Low-Income Weatherization Program. Typical levels represent 185 percent of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines.
